CONFESSION & FORGIVENESS

P: Brothers and sisters in Christ, God created us to know joy in communion with him, to love all humanity, and to live in harmony with all creation. But sin separates us from God, our neighbors, and creation, and so we do not enjoy the life our Creator intended for us. By our sin we grieve our Father, who does not desire us to come under his judgment, but to turn to him and live. Therefore, God in his mercy has sent our Lord Jesus Christ to take our place under the law, to suffer for us, and to die the death we deserve. God made Jesus, who had no sin, to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

During these days of Lent we fix our eyes on Jesus, the Author and Perfecter of our faith, who for the joy set before him endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of God. The time of Lent reminds us that to know Christ and the power of his resurrection, we must also know the fellowship of sharing in his sufferings, becoming like him in his death. As disciples of the Lord Jesus we are called to struggle against everything that leads us away from love of God and neighbor.

I invite you, therefore, to confess your sins, ask our Father for forgiveness, and commit yourselves to this struggle. Let us be silent. Let us be still. Let us pause now for a time of reflection and self-examination.

- P: “Blessed is he whose transgressions are forgiven, whose sins are covered.”
- C: **“Blessed is the man whose sin the Lord does not count against him and in whose spirit is no deceit.”** (*Psalms 32:1-2*)
- P: “Search me, O God, and know my heart; test me and know my anxious thoughts.”
- C: **“See if there is any offensive way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting.”**
(*Psalms 139:23-24*)
- P: We confess to you, O God, that our hearts too often turn from your way.
- C: **We have chased after things we thought would make us feel good. We have neglected things that are good.**
- P: We confess to you, O God, that our minds too often turn from your truth.
- C: **We have flirted with falsehood and rationalized wrongs. We have questioned your goodness and challenged your justice.**
- P: “Hide your face from my sins and blot out all my iniquity.”
- C: **“Restore to me the joy of your salvation and grant me a willing spirit to sustain me.”** (*Psalms 51:9 and 12*)
- P: Your sin is forgiven, for Jesus paid its price. Your guilt is gone, because Jesus endured its shame. You have received the Holy Spirit to assure you that God is your dear Father and to empower you to live as his daughters and sons.

C: **Remind us of what Jesus said. Teach us all things, Spirit of Truth. Fill us with Jesus' love and power.**


