EASTER SONRISE SERVICE

"We are going up to Jerusalem, and the Son of Man will be betrayed to the chief priests and the teachers of the law. They will condemn him to death and will turn him over to the Gentiles to be mocked and flogged and crucified. On the third day he will be raised to life!" Matthew 20:18-19

PRESERVICE MUSIC

WORSHIP NOTES: May your heart be filled with hope and joy on this most joyous of Christian celebrations: the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ from the dead! As the Apostle says, we have been buried with Him by our baptism and we are also raised with Him. We no longer live, but Christ lives in us...and His love compels us, because we are convinced that One died for all, and therefore all died. And He died for all, that those who live should no longer live for themselves, but for Him who died for them and was raised again.

DARKNESS The service at church typically begins in darkness. Before the women came to the tomb on Easter morning, it was dark. The darkness of Good Friday still envelops the tomb. Darkness in the Bible symbolizes the devil's rule on earth, sin that ravages mankind and death. Today we'll show "sonrise" by opening the triptych.

ENTRANCE OF LIGHT The Christ candle which exited at the close of our Good Friday evening service, symbolizing Christ's death and burial, now enters. It represents Jesus, the light of the world, who is alive! It represents the flash of light which blinded the guards at the tomb. It represents the light of faith, which fills our heart and our life. As the Christ candle enters we begin our Easter worship.



EASTER LITANY - *(please rise)*

- Pastor: He's alive! The Lord has risen from the dead!
Cong: He has conquered death! Jesus has destroyed all our enemies. Alleluia!
- Pastor: Let all doubt be cast aside! His resurrection proves that he is the Son of God. (Romans 1)
Cong: By faith we are his forgiven children!
- Pastor: We follow him into new life!
Cong: He is Risen! Together we sing his praises!

PRAYER (congregation)

O risen Lord, as the sun rises this joyous morning to bring light to all the world, show us through your resurrection that you are the Sun of Righteousness. THE PRAYER FOR FORGIVENESS (congregation)

In the Name of Jesus, O Lord God, have mercy on me, a sinner. Forgive my open sins and my secret sins. Forgive the sins I know and the sins I do not know. Forgive the sins I did to please myself and the sins I did to please others. Forgive them all, gracious Lord, for Jesus' sake.

THE ABSOLUTION FROM SIN (pastor)

The Holy Spirit brings you peace and Easter assures you of victory over sin and death through the atonement of God's own Son. Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by his command and authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

EASTER RESPONSES

(The responses of this service reflect the joy and triumph which is ours in the resurrection of our Lord. These opening expressions are an ancient greeting Christians used to greet each other on Easter during the first century.)

Pastor: Christ is Risen!

Pastor: Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ!

Cong: **In his great mercy he has given us a new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead.**

Pastor: May God make you complete in everything good so that you may do his will, as he works in us that which is pleasing in his sight through Jesus Christ.


Cong: To Jesus Christ be the glory forever and ever! Amen.


