VERSICLE: "While he was blessing them, he left them and was taken up into heaven." Luke 24:51

#### PRAYER OF THE DAY

Lord Jesus, King of glory, on this day you ascended far above the heavens and at God's right hand you rule the nations. We pray that you do not leave us not alone, but grant us the Spirit of truth. At your command and by your power may we be your witnesses in all the world; for you live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

**WORSHIP NOTES:** The festival of Ascension has been celebrated since the early centuries of the Christian Church. Along with Christmas and Easter, it's considered one of the most important festivals of the Church year. This evening, like other believers before us, we celebrate the Ascension of the Lord Jesus. We know that we will see him again and go to be where he is. That's how much he loves us! He goes so that he come again and take us to share in his glory! When will he restore the kingdom? When the time is best! We are happy to leave it to him and to be busy with the work he has given us to do while we wait. We might note that he tells very little of what we will experience when we join him there. He doesn't want us to focus on that just yet, but on his Word and on what he wants us to do while we know that we will be with him forever.

P: On this Ascension Day we are reminded that our Father in heaven has not forgotten us. In fact, his Son, our Savior, returned to God's house to prepare a place for us. Yet too often we live and act as if we have forgotten about His saving work.

#### C: Forgive us, dear Lord.

P: We acknowledge our apathy for the gospel, our laxity in proclaiming the good news of salvation, and our failure to support the Lord's work with the generous use of our time, talents and treasures.

C: Dear Jesus, have mercy on us.

- P: We confess that we take God's precious Word and Sacraments for granted. Too frequently we place worldly and personal pleasures above spiritual and eternal desires.
- C: Have mercy on us, O Lord.
- P: The Lord knows our thoughts, hears our words, and sees our actions. We can hide nothing from him.
- C: Dear Father in heaven, forgive us all our sins for the sake of Jesus, your Son, our risen, ascended and glorious Savior.

#### WE RECEIVE GOD'S FORGIVENESS

P: God has heard our plea for mercy and forgiveness. In His perfect love and compassion he has forgiven us all our sins. Rejoice in the comfort of God's full pardon. And in thankfulness to him and all he does for us, let us recommit ourselves to the tasks he gives us and serve him willingly and joyfully. God's peace be with you. Amen.

#### THE LESSON FROM GOD'S WORD

P: At Jesus' ascension, two angels spoke one of God's great promises: *"This same Jesus, who has been taken back from you into heaven, will come back in the same way you have seen him go into heaven."* God is always true to his promises. Our faith, a precious gift from the Holy Spirit, clings to all of God's promises. In fact, it is our Savior and his promises that give great meaning to this year's school theme: "Serving Our Savior." By faith, we know and believe that Jesus came to be our Savior. By faith, we trust that he who visibly ascended into heaven, will "come back" so that we and all believers will receive God's precious gift of eternal life and salvation! Out of love for our Savior we eagerly serve him.

#### READING Acts 1:1-11

In my former book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus began to do and to teach until the day he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles he has chosen. After his suffering, he showed himself to these men and gave many convincing proofs that he was alive. He appeared to them over a period of forty days and spoke about the kingdom of God. On one occasion, while he was eating with them, he gave them this command: "Do not leave Jerusalem, but wait for the gift my Father promised, which you have heard me speak about. For John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit." So when they met together they asked him, "Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom of Israel?" He said to them, "It is not for you to know the times or dates the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." After he said this, he was taken up before their very eyes, and a cloud hid him from their sight. They were looking intently up into the sky as he was going, when suddenly two men dressed in white stood beside them. "Men of Galilee," they said, "why do you stand here looking into the sky? This same Jesus, who has been taken from you into heaven, will come back in the same way you have seen him go into heaven."


