

WORSHIP NOTES: This weekend we zero in on the relationship between Father, Son and Holy Spirit – the Holy Trinity. Our Gospel lesson will state clearly from Jesus' Great Commission that all his work connects us to him and to the three-person-one God. This mystery plays a special part in our understanding of our earthly struggle, as the Apostle Paul tells the Corinthians about the warfare and the weapons of engagement. We are called to fight in a new way, as those who have taken thoughts captive to Christ. Today we begin our Summer Sermon Series, "Engaged in the Struggle of Life."


THE COMMON SERVICE CW, p. 15




P: God, our heavenly Father, has been merciful to us and has given his only Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by his authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.



P: In the peace of forgiveness let us praise the Lord.



C: Glory be to God on high, and on earth peace, good will toward men.




P: The Lord be with you.



P: Let us pray.

O God, you rule over all things in wisdom and kindness. Take away everything that may be harmful and give us whatever is good; through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

The eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had directed them. When they saw him, they worshipped him, but some hesitated because they were uncertain. 


THE SERMON


THE PRAYERS and THE LORD'S PRAYERS



- P: The peace of the Lord be with you always.




