

WORSHIP NOTES Welcome to our worship this morning! Our Summer Sermon Series continues today, "Engaged in the Struggle of Life." We cannot and must not ignore or avoid the social illnesses around us. ORDER OF WORSHIP

GOD WELCOMES US

- **P:** On behalf of our risen Savior Jesus Christ, I welcome you all to God's house. But why have you come?
- C: We share the Psalmist's joy when he said, "I rejoice with those who said to me, Let us go to the house of the Lord." We come with joy to rejoice that God is our Savior.
- **P:** How good it is to rejoice in the name of the Lord. Let's begin then by lifting up our hearts and voices in praise to God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

WE CONFESS OUR SINS

- **P:** God clearly says in his Word that the only one who may ascend the hill of the Lord and stand in his presence is the one who has clean hands and a pure heart.
- C: But we are a sinful people. We have unclean lips and we live among people with unclean lips. God says, "If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness." So we come to confess our sins and to seek his forgiveness.

- **P**: It is good that we do not hide or make excuses for our sins because God sees and knows everything about us. Rather let us confess our sins and lay them before Christ's cross so that through his mercy we might hear his words of forgiveness.
- ALL: Dear God of all mercy, we come before your holy throne today seeking your forgiveness for our rebellion. We are by nature inclined to put ourselves or our things first. We have not always loved our neighbors as ourselves, but we have at times been mean, lying, lustful, arrogant, greedy and selfish. Forgive us for our worldliness and our lack of godliness. Forgive us for all the times we refused to listen to your word, trust in your power, and obey your commands. Forgive us in your mercy so that we are not destroyed in your anger.

GOD PUBLICLY FORGIVES OUR SINS

P: The Lord has assured us "As surely as I live, I take no pleasure in the death of the wicked, but rather that they turn from their ways and live." In fact, "God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life." Therefore, on behalf of and by the command of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, I forgive you of all your sins and declare you clean of your guilt in the name of the Almighty God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

GOD FEEDS US WITH HIS WORD

- **P:** Now that you have experienced that the Lord is good, have received God's forgiveness and are assured of his loving mercy, what else have you come for?
- C: Jesus said, "Blessed are those who hear the word of God and obey it." So we come to sit at his feet and to listen to his word for it is, "A lamp for our feet and a light for our paths."

GOSPEL Matthew 9:9-13

Jesus' mission was to save sinners. So he associated with notorious ne'er-do-wells like Matthew and called them into his kingdom. The grace that offended the Pharisees compels each of us to give thanks.

As Jesus went on from there, he saw a man named Matthew sitting at the tax collector's booth. "Follow me," he told him, and Matthew got up and followed him. While Jesus was having dinner at Matthew's house, many tax collectors and "sinners" came and ate with him and his disciples. When the Pharisees saw this, they asked his disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and 'sinners'?" On hearing this, Jesus said, "It is not the healthy who need a doctor, but the sick. But go and learn what this means: 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice.' For I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners."
