



FIRST LESSON 1 Thessalonians 3:1-13

So when we could stand it no longer, we thought it best to be left by ourselves in Athens. We sent Timothy, who is our brother and co-worker in God's service in spreading the gospel of Christ, to strengthen and encourage you in your faith, so that no one would be unsettled by these trials. For you know quite well that we are destined for them. In fact, when we were with you, we kept telling you that we would be persecuted. And it turned out that way, as you well know. For this reason, when I could stand it no longer, I sent to find out about your faith. I was afraid that in some way the tempter had tempted you and that our labors might have been in vain. But Timothy has just now come to us from you and has brought good news about your faith and love. He has told us that you always have pleasant memories of us and that you long to see us, just as we also long to see you. Therefore, brothers and sisters, in all our distress and persecution we were encouraged about you because of your faith. For now we really live, since you are standing firm in the Lord. How can we thank God enough for you in return for all the joy we have in the presence of our God because of you? Night and day we pray most earnestly that we may see you again and supply what is lacking in your faith. Now may our God and Father himself and our Lord Jesus clear the way for us to come to you. May the Lord make your love increase and overflow for each other and for everyone else, just as ours does for you. May he strengthen your hearts so that you will be blameless and holy in the presence of our God and Father when our Lord Jesus comes with all his holy ones.

VERSE OF THE DAY

P: Alleluia. My grace is sufficient for you,

C: for my power is made perfect in weakness. Alleluia. (2 Corinthians 12:9a)

GOSPEL MATTHEW 20:1-16

What is our God like? Jesus teaches us with a story, but we struggle with the lesson. The parable offends our finely honed sense of what's fair and what's not. When we keep our eyes where they belong - fixed on God - then have a correct view of our worth and labor. Then, when God places a denarius in our hands, we can marvel that the Lord isn't fair - thanks be to God! He doesn't give us what we deserve; no, he gives us what we don't.

"For the kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who went out early in the morning to hire men to work in his vineyard. He agreed to pay them a denarius for the day and sent them into his vineyard. "About the third hour he went out and saw others standing in the marketplace doing nothing. He told them, 'You also go and work in my vineyard, and I will pay you whatever is right.' So they went. "He went out again about the sixth hour and the ninth hour and did the same thing. About the eleventh hour he went out and found still others standing around. He asked them, 'Why have you been standing here all day long doing nothing?' "'Because no one has hired us,' they answered. "He said to them, 'You also go and work in my vineyard.' "When evening came, the owner of the vineyard said to his foreman, 'Call the workers and pay them their wages, beginning with the last ones hired and going on to the first.' "The workers who were hired about the eleventh hour came and each received a denarius. So when those came

who were hired first, they expected to receive more. But each one of them also received a denarius. When they received it, they began to grumble against the landowner. 'These men who were hired last worked only one hour,' they said, 'and you have made them equal to us who have borne the burden of the work and the heat of the day.' "But he answered one of them, 'Friend, I am not being unfair to you. Didn't you agree to work for a denarius? Take your pay and go. I want to give the man who was hired last the same as I gave you. Don't I have the right to do what I want with my own money? Or are you envious because I am generous?' "So the last will be first, and the first will be last."




WORDS OF INSTITUTION







For Me to Live Is Jesus



5 Amen! For Christ my Savior Will grant this unto me.
Your Spirit lead me ever That I fare happily.

Intro: Satan is real. He tries to harm gospel work. We need discernment and protection, yet we need not be discouraged. God has given us his Word, and in its promises we are regularly reassured. The community of believers will stand by each other.

Our Encouragement: Longing to Share

1. Concern: how separation from each other can harm us. (2:17-20)

- 1.1 Christ's community has always had this happening to them.
- 1.2 In early Christianity it built stronger bonds while distributing blessings.

APP: No one wants persecution or rough times. But these are the tests of character and perseverance for which we are uniquely qualified.

2. Cost: how the act of God demonstrates commitment. (3:1-5)

- 2.1 Friendship acknowledges our weaknesses.
- 2.2 Support in the day of discouragement is the role model from above.

APP: Even Jesus discovered the strengthening of the angels in his critical moments. We need each other because (in so far as) we remind ourselves together, "God's got this!"

3. Consolation: how the receiving of Good News brings relief. (3:6-13)

- 3.1 Our best friends bring refreshment through the gentle reminders of his love.
- 3.2 True comfort lies in promises kept and promises coming.

APP: We need friends who can support us in our desire to be different in the face of pressure or even hostility to conform. Paul felt that his presence with the believers in Thessalonica would have enabled them to stand firm in the face of persecution.

Conclusion: Two major responsibilities of pastoral ministry flow out of the previous passage (2:1-16) and this one (2:17-3:13) – our commitment to the Word of God (2:2, 8, 9, 13), and our commitment to the people of God.
