Order of Worship

PASTOR WELCOMES US TO WORSHIP

WE OPEN WITH SONG "LO, HE COMES WITH CLOUDS DESCENDING" (P.8) CWS #704:1-3

WE ASK THE LORD TO FORGIVE US AND LEAD US

- P: This is the day which the Lord has made, let us rejoice and be glad in it. Jesus said, "I am the Way and the Truth and the Life." Aware of his Advent among us, we gather this day in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit.
- C: Lord, come to live in us! Lord, help us live for you! Lord, let us praise you with our hearts, souls, and minds. We sing for joy to the Lord and shout aloud to the Rock of our salvation.

THE CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS OF SINS

- P: O Lord, in your holiness you show your anger because we've sinned. Like the children of Israel, your chosen people, we continue to sin even when we know what we're doing.
- C: Can we still be rescued from the darkness and dominion of evil?
- P: Not by ourselves, for the prophet Isaiah declares that we've all become unclean, our righteous acts are like permanently stained rags and we shrivel like the dead leaves. Our sins carry us away like the wind.
- C: Apart from the gospel, no one calls on your name. Left to ourselves, we are ruined in our sin. Lord, God of grace, please do not hide your face from us.
- P: Father, forgive us for we have sinned against your holiness and your good will. Tear open our hearts with repentance. Remove our guilt forever.
- C: Do not be angry with us, Lord, for we are your people. Come down and look upon us with mercy.

(Quiet Moments for Personal Prayer & Confession)

- P: Our God is a great God. He provides for all our needs. He gives us daily bread and draws us to himself with his love. Our sin no longer controls us. Our lives are the response to his love. The death of his Son, Jesus Christ, has paid the cost of our sin and has set us free to live in victory. We are forgiven. We are sons and daughters of the King. We are "ministers of reconciliation" to each other as we share in the forgiveness of sins. Praise God for his compassion and love.
- C: Rejoice! The LORD IS Come!

WE PRAISE GOD WITH OUR LIVES

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON Malachi 4:1-6

It's not an idle question: Do you want the Savior who was promised? He is the only Savior there will ever be. Those who despise the message of his coming either because they don't like the messenger or because they are too proud to receive salvation as a gift, will be humbled. Make no mistake about that! Their humbling will be devastating, complete, everlasting. Fathers, prepare your children for the real Savior, the real gift at Christmas. Children, turn your ears to your father's words and make ready to receive the only gift that matters, and the only one that will save when he comes again in judgment.

"Surely the day is coming; it will burn like a furnace. All the arrogant and every evildoer will be stubble, and that day that is coming will set them on fire," says the LORD Almighty. "Not a root or a branch will be left to them. But for you who revere my name, the sun of righteousness will rise with healing in its wings. And you will go out and leap like calves released from the stall. Then you will trample down the wicked; they will be ashes under the soles of your feet on the day when I do these things," says the LORD Almighty. "Remember the law of my servant Moses, the decrees and laws I gave him at Horeb for all Israel. "See, I will send you the prophet Elijah before that great and dreadful day of the LORD comes. He will turn the hearts of the fathers to their children, and the hearts of the children to their fathers; or else I will come and strike the land with a curse."

GOSPEL LESSON Joh

John 1:6-8, 19-28

A lot of people still just want the twinkling of Christmas tree lights and the glitter of tinsel. They do not want the Light of the world who will dispel the darkness of unbelief with the light of the gospel. They may want something at Christmas that looks a little religious. But they do not want to confess with John that they are all darkness and foolishness, all sin and perversity, until the Light comes to expel the darkness of unbelief and save by his works and not our own. What do you want for Christmas?

There came a man who was sent from God; his name was John. He came as a witness to testify concerning that light, so that through him all men might believe. He himself was not the light; he came only as a witness to the light. Now this was John's testimony when the Jews of Jerusalem sent priests and Levites to ask him who he was. He did not fail to confess, but confessed freely, "I am not the Christ. " They asked him, "Then who are you? Are you Elijah?" He said, "I am not." "Are you the Prophet?" He answered, "No." Finally they said, "Who are you? Give us an answer to take back to those who sent us. What do you say about yourself?" John replied in the words of Isaiah the prophet, "I am the voice of one calling in the desert, 'Make straight the way for the Lord.' " Now some Pharisees who had been sent questioned him, "Why then do you baptize if you are not the Christ, nor Elijah, nor the Prophet?" "I baptize with water," John replied, "but among you stands one you do not know. He is the one who comes after me, the thongs of whose sandals I am not worthy to untie." This all happened at Bethany on the other side of the Jordan, where John was baptizing.

WE STATE WHAT WE BELIEVE

- P: Because we need a Creator to make sense of our world, because we need a Father who will care for us in this world, because Scripture gives us this God we need:
- C: I believe in God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth.
- P: Because we need a Substitute willing to take our place under divine law and divine justice, because we need a Sacrifice sufficient to pay for all our sins, because we need a Lord who will take our side in the judgment, because Scripture gives us this Savior we need:
- C: I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day he rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty. From there he will come to judge the living and the dead.
- P: Because we need the certainty of faith and the comfort of hope, because we need a community of believers who will share our Christian walk, because Scripture gives us this Spirit we need:
- C: I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.





