Our Savior Ev. Lutheran 12-25-20 Christmas Day

Intro: "He sat down." The implications of this phrase are staggering! No priest in Israel sat down while functioning in his role as mediator, they could never rest because their work was never done. But Jesus, our superior savior, sits now in honor on THE throne.

The Promise of God's Rule

1. Christ Rules as the Final Revelation from God. (Hebrews Overview)

- 1.1 His Excellence Appears as the Perfect Spokesman.
- 1.2 He is certainly superior to the prophets.
- 1.3 He is not just another messenger; he himself is the message.

App: Revelations were no longer necessary after his arrival because Jesus is the sum of all God's teachings. We can trust Jesus because we can trust the sender – God the Father has placed the seal of approval and authenticity on him.

2. Christ Calls as the Ultimate Savior of the World. (Hebrews 1:1-3)

- 2.1 The Jews thought that salvation would come from them.
- 2.2 But Jesus paid the ransom and made the gift freely available.
- 2.3 His blood did what their (or any) religion could never do.

App: He isn't just a remarkable stain remover, he's the one and only person who can recreate us with a pronouncement. He's the judge who declares us not guilty!

3. Christ Leads as the Only Lord for All Time. (Hebrews 1:4-9)

- 3.1 Angels will be heard on high.
- 3.2 They were called "sons of God" but never "MY SON."
- 3.3 Jesus is the Prince anointed and enthroned to rule over all.

Conclusion: There is no comparison between the way our Lord and worldly representatives lead. Here's (the manger) his king-sized bed to remind us that he is and always was bound to us in love.
