

WORSHIP NOTES: David holds a role in Hebrew history as the mighty warrior, the one who challenged a giant and won. Yet in Psalm 38 he speaks from a position of weakness, a man who sounds afflicted and vulnerable. As such, he gives voice to our own fear – of being helpless. Today we encounter the stark reality of Lent, the onslaught of God's arrows in the Law, wounding us. But we also see someone whose confession doesn't just stop at his sin, but moves on to his Savior. David reminds us that we can cry out to God for help and he hears us.

PRAYER OF THE DAY: Almighty God, you see that we have no power to defend ourselves. Guard and keep us both outwardly and inwardly from all adversities that may happen to the body and from all evil thoughts that may assault and hurt the soul; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. AMEN.

WE HEAR THE WORD FROM THE EPISTLE LESSON EPHESIANS 2:4-10

Get this straight – grace – faith – works! Salvation is alone by God's grace through faith in Jesus Christ. That faith responds with a life of loving obedience. What God has done, not what we do, has accomplished our salvation. And we have been saved to serve.

But because of his great love for us, God, who is rich in mercy, made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in transgressions—it is by grace you have been saved. And God raised us up with Christ and seated us with him in the heavenly realms in Christ Jesus, in order that in the coming ages he might show the incomparable riches of his grace, expressed in his kindness to us in Christ Jesus. For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God— not by works, so that no one can boast. For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do.

WE HEAR THE WORD FROM THE GOSPEL JOHN 3:14-21

Jesus foretold his crucifixion, using the bronze snake of today's Old Testament lesson prophetically. Faith in his death for our sin assures salvation. Rejecting Jesus and his sacrificial death earns eternal condemnation. The way people live reflects what they believe.

Just as Moses lifted up the snake in the wilderness, so the Son of Man must be lifted up, that everyone who believes may have eternal life in him." For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him. Whoever believes in him is not condemned, but whoever does not believe stands condemned already because they have not believed in the name of God's one and only Son. This is the verdict: Light has come into the world, but people loved darkness instead of light because their deeds were evil. Everyone who does evil hates the light, and will not come into the light for fear that their deeds will be exposed. But whoever lives by the truth comes into the light, so that it may be seen plainly that what they have done has been done in the sight of God.

WE AFFIRM OUR FAITH (from Romans 8)

ALL: We have received the spirit of sonship, and by him we cry: "Abba, Father." The Spirit himself testifies with our spirit that we are God's children, heirs of God and coheirs with Christ... in order that we may also share in his glory... the Spirit himself intercedes for us.

If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare his own son, but gave him up for us all --how will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things? Christ Jesus, who died -- more than that, who was raised to life -- is at the right hand of God and is also interceding for us.

In all things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For we are convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Intro: In this Psalm we hear the voice of one who recognizes the enormity of sin under God's condemnation. Intense, rapid-paced language reveals the potency of the law. Like arrows, God's indictments wound us; like salve God's mercies heal us.

How the Weakness of Faith becomes Our Strength

1. Pursued: I feel like you're shooting at me. (38:1-8)

- 1.1 Previously I relied on my agility and ability to survive.
- 1.2 Now I find myself pinned down and disadvantaged.
- 1.3 God is still working on me.

App: Sometimes we hide our weaknesses, from God and from ourselves. Times of illness can actually help us to open up, admit our sin and seek our Savior.

2. Oppressed: My friends are avoiding me. (38:9-16)

- 2.1 When our dreams start to slip through our fingers, we feel vulnerable.
- 2.2 Some day we may also feel discarded and worthless.

App: Feeling helpless can in fact help us. It trims our pride and returns us to a dependency on another, the one who will never forsake us.

3. Pleading: I need your help, dear Savior. (38:17-22)

- 3.1 God is compassionate. He hears us cry out to him.
- 3.2 Trembling, we reach out in faith.

App: Our confession and awareness of weakness leads to a new strength, unattainable unless we ask and receive the Spirit's gift.

Conclusion: God did not ignore David's confession – his confession of sinfulness; his confession of faith. Let our Lenten confession be just as strong in faith.
