THE ACCLAMATION On Palm Sunday a throng of people acclaimed Jesus as he entered Jerusalem on his way to the cross.

- P: Hosanna to the Son of David!

- P: Hosanna to him who by his willing sacrifice, canceled the guilt of all our offenses!
- C: Hosanna to the Son of David!
- P: Hosanna to him who ascended on high as king, leading captivity captive!
- C: Hosanna in the highest!

THE CONFESSION AND PROMISE OF FORGIVENESS

- **P:** God's Word tells us: If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just, and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness. Let us join in confessing our sins to God, confident of his grace and pardon:
- C: O almighty God, my Creator and Redeemer, I confess to you that I am sinful in my very nature, and that I have sinned against you in my thoughts, words, and actions. I do repent and ask your forgiveness through Jesus Christ, who died for me and was raised again.
- **P:** God's Word tells us that Jesus Christ was delivered over to death for our sins and was raised to life for our justification. Therefore, having heard your confession and on the basis of God's promise in Jesus, I assure you that your sins are all forgiven, in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.
- C: Amen.
- P: In the peace of forgiveness, let us praise the Lord!

THE PRAYER

- **P:** Not unto us, O Lord, not unto us but to Your name be the glory
- C: because of Your love and faithfulness.
- **P:** We praise you, O God, for the great acts of love by which you redeemed us through your Son, Jesus Christ.
- C: As he was acclaimed by those who scattered their garments and branches of palm in his path, so may we always hail him as our King and follow him with perfect confidence; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. AMEN.

THE OLD TESTAMENT LESSON Zechariah 9:9-10

Believers are told to rejoice because their king and Savior is coming. He is almighty and will be victorious over his enemies even though he will come gently, riding on a donkey. Today is also Palm Sunday, recalling his entry as King.

Rejoice greatly, O Daughter of Zion! Shout, Daughter of Jerusalem! See, your king comes to you, righteous and having salvation, gentle and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey. I will take away the chariots from Ephraim and the war-horses from Jerusalem, and the battle bow will be broken. He will proclaim peace to the nations. His rule will extend from sea to sea and from the River to the ends of the earth.

- P: Why are you downcast, O my soul? Why so disturbed within me?
- C: Put your hope in God. For I will yet praise him, my Savior and my God.

THE EPISTLE LESSON Philippians 2:5-11

Jesus, our Savior, is Lord of all. He did not display his glory while on this earth. Instead he became our humble substitute and died to save us. Now his Father has exalted him above all things, and one day he will be recognized as King of all by all people.

Your attitude should be the same as that of Christ Jesus: Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be grasped, but made himself nothing, taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself and became obedient to death even death on a cross! Therefore God exalted him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Sermon Outline Mark 11:1-11

Intro: To which crowd do we belong? The manipulators of power who entered along with Pilate on the west side of Jerusalem, or the pilgrim populace who welcomed the true king with pure praise?

Hands of Praise (Disciples & Crowd)

1. These hands are active in obedience not passive in the pew.

- 1.1 The disciples do what they are told without question.
- 1.2 The world wants to design its own system of control & fame.
- 1.3 The gifts given to Jesus went way beyond a few material things.


App: This event follows Jesus' special anointing – one woman was listening and longing to honor him. Embedded inside the flow of events is an irony: one of his own would conspire to bribery and betrayal. She is embalming the body that Judas will deliver over to the enemy hands.

2. These hands are uplifted with the most natural response of faith.

- 2.1 The kingdom of David spreads beyond the Jews.
- 2.2 The enthusiasm was spontaneous and sincere.
- 2.3 This word would go out beyond Jerusalem, to all in need.

App: There are only two groups of people watching Jesus enter on this day – those who praised and supported him; those who mocked and hated him.

Conclusion: He is the king who enters our hearts, not with force but with mutual respect. Once we have seen how he leads and rules by giving his life as a ransom, how can we do anything less than respond with uplifted hands.
