
FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT March 21, 2021

WORSHIP NOTES: During Lent, our focus on the suffering and death of Jesus leads us to see clearly what a tremendous sacrifice he has made for us. How beautiful is our journey to the cross and tomb. We have seen our Savior's battle waged against temptation. We have found confidence in his resolution to carry out the Father's plan of salvation. We have turned to the Lord at his invitation to draw near with repentant hearts. And we have rejoiced in his loving and forgiving embrace. In these final hours before Holy Week, we see his "intercessory" role as our Great High Priest reach it's fulfillment. Our message today comes from Hebrews, which explains why he had to suffer in our place and become the sacrifice himself that had been anticipated.

The Lord's Supper, which we celebrate today, is an evidence and an expression of the unity of faith shared by those who commune together. For that reason we ask that only persons who are members of congregations in fellowship with the WELS participate in the sacrament with us. Other guests are encouraged to speak to our pastor for information about participating in the Lord's Supper at our altar.

PRAYER OF THE DAY

FIRST LESSON Jeremiah 31:31-34

The Lord gave his people everything, but they rebelled and threw it all away. So he promised a "new covenant" for his people. This is the one-sided agreement by which he forgives their wickedness and remembers their sins no more.

"The time is coming," declares the Lord, "when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and with the house of Judah. It will not be like the covenant I made with their forefathers when I took them by the hand to lead them out of Egypt, because they broke my covenant, though I was a husband to them, " declares the Lord. "This is the covenant I will make with the house of Israel after that time," declares the Lord. "I will put my law in their minds and write it on their hearts. I will be their God, and they will be my people. No longer will a man teach his neighbor, or a man his brother, saying, 'Know the Lord,' because they will all know me, from the least of them to the greatest," declares the Lord. "For I will forgive their wickedness and will remember their sins no more."

SECOND LESSON Hebrews 5:7-9

Throughout his lifetime and especially in the Garden of Gethsemane, Jesus pleaded with his heavenly Father "with loud cries and tears" -- so terrible would his suffering be. Yet he obeyed his Father's will and proved to be the Source of our eternal salvation from sin and death.

During the days of Jesus' life on earth, he offered up prayers and petitions with loud cries and tears to the one who could save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission. Although he was a son, he learned obedience from what he suffered and, once made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him.

VERSE OF THE DAY

P: The Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve;

C: and to give his life as a ransom for many. (Mark 10:45)

GOSPEL John 12:20-33

Jesus' path to glory did not take him to fame and fortune. It led to the cross and to his death. By rising from the dead Jesus now draws all people to himself and gives them the gift of eternal life.

Now there were some Greeks among those who went up to worship at the Feast. They came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, with a request. "Sir," they said, "we would like to see Jesus." Philip went to tell Andrew; Andrew and Philip in turn told Jesus. Jesus replied, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. I tell you the truth, unless a kernel of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains only a single seed. But if it dies, it produces many seeds. The man who loves his life will lose it, while the man who hates his life in this world will keep it for eternal life. Whoever serves me must follow me; and where I am, my servant also will be. My Father will honor the one who serves me. "Now my heart is troubled, and what shall I say? 'Father, save me from this hour'? No, it was for this very reason I came to this hour. Father, glorify your name!" Then a voice came from heaven, "I have glorified it, and will glorify it again." The crowd that was there and heard it said it had thundered; others said an angel had spoken to him. Jesus said, "This voice was for your benefit, not mine. Now is the time for judgment on this world; now the prince of this world will be driven out. But I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all men to myself." He said this to show the kind of death he was going to die.


