MAUNDY THURSDAY 2021

THE PRELUDE

WORSHIP NOTES: Just as Ash Wednesday begins Lent so Maundy Thursday marks the end of Lent proper and the beginning of "the most holy three days of the crucified, buried, and risen Lord" (St. Augustine). The day takes its name from the Latin *mandatum novum*, the "new command" of Jesus to his disciples of all time to love each other as he has loved (John 13:34). The institution of the Lord's Supper sets forth the depth of Jesus' love and gives power to the church to live out his command. Maundy Thursday is a festival in which reconciliation is solemnly expressed and in which the congregation makes its transition from preparation for the celebration of the mystery of Christ's suffering to the celebration itself. Maundy Thursday thus shares a similar character to Ash Wednesday with its special confession of sins and words of reconciliation that began Lent.

HOLY COMMUNION

Participation in the Lord's Supper is a privilege Jesus extends to persons who adhere to his Word and have publicly confessed their oneness in faith. This biblical teaching is the basis for our practice of "close communion" at Our Savior. Guests are asked to speak with our pastor if they wish to commune.

SILENT PRAYER BEFORE SERVICE

Lord Jesus, this holy Thursday was a solemn day for you and is now a sacred day for us. As we meditate today on what you said and did during the hours before you were crucified, help us to hear your word with understanding and to celebrate your supper with a genuine appreciation for what it cost you and for what it means for us. Deepen our resolve to reflect your commitment to us in our devotion to you. Aware of your suffering for our sake, we pray. Amen.

PASSION HISTORY LESSON John 19:10-15

"Do you refuse to speak to me?" Pilate said. "Don't you realize I have power either to free you or to crucify you?" Jesus answered, "You would have no power over me if it were not given to you from above. Therefore the one who handed me over to you is guilty of a greater sin." From then on, Pilate tried to set Jesus free, but the Jews kept shouting, "If you let this man go, you are no friend of Caesar. Anyone who claims to be a king opposes Caesar." When Pilate heard this, he brought Jesus out and sat down on the judge's seat at a place known as the Stone Pavement (which in Aramaic is Gabbatha). It was the day of Preparation of Passover Week, about the sixth hour. "Here is your king," Pilate said to the Jews. But they shouted, "Take him away! Take him away! Crucify him!" "Shall I crucify your king?" Pilate asked. "We have no king but Caesar," the chief priests answered.

INSTRUCTION FOR THE END OF LENT

P: In this Lenten season we have heard again how our Lord walked the path of suffering which led him to the cross for our salvation. We have also heard our Lord's call to intensify our struggle against sin, death, and the devil—all that keeps us from loving God and one another. This is the struggle to which we were committed at Baptism; God's forgiveness and the power of his Spirit to amend our lives continue with us because of his love for us in Jesus our Savior.

Within the family of the Church, God never wearies of giving peace and new life. In the absolution, we receive forgiveness as from God himself. This absolution we should

not doubt but firmly believe that our sins are forgiven before God in heaven, for it comes to us in the name and by the command of our Lord.

We who receive God's love in Jesus Christ are called to love one another, to be servants to each other, as Jesus became our servant.

In Holy Communion the members of Christ's body participate most intimately in his unconditional love. Remembering our Lord's Last Supper with his disciples, we eat the bread and drink the cup of this meal. Together we receive the Lord's gift of his body and blood for forgiveness and take part in that new covenant that makes us one with him and one another. The Lord's Supper is our covenant meal with God, the promise of the great banquet we will share with all the faithful when our Lord returns. Here we celebrate the joyous reconciliation with God and each other.

CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

P: Let us confess our sins to God and ask for his forgiveness.

STAND

C: Almighty God, merciful Father,

I confess to you that I have not loved you with all my heart.

In what I have done and left undone, I have pursued my ways instead of your ways.

I have not loved my brothers and sisters as myself.

For this I deserve your punishment both now and in eternity.

I am truly sorry for my sins. I repent of them.

I beg for your mercy, O Lord.

Silence for meditation

P: Forgive us for the sake of Jesus Christ who suffered and died for us.

- C: Cleanse me from my sins.
 - Release me from my guilt.

Grant me your Holy Spirit to amend my sinful life.

The minister pronounces a corporate absolution with these words:

- P: The almighty God has been merciful to us and has sent his Son to die for all. For his sake, God forgives our sins and calls us from darkness to his marvelous light.
 Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by his authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen.

EXHORTATION

P: Our Lord Jesus Christ has forgiven us and reconciled us to God and has promised us the power to forgive and love each other. Relying on his promise, therefore, be reconciled with one another.

ALL: Brothers and sisters, may the peace of Christ rule in our hearts, in our words, and in our actions.

PRAYER OF THE DAY

- P: Let us pray. Lord Jesus Christ, in the Sacrament of Holy Communion you give us your true body and blood as a remembrance of your suffering and death on the cross. Grant us so firmly to believe your words and promise that we may always receive this Sacrament to our eternal good, for you live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.
- C: Amen.

THE FIRST SCRIPTURE READING

Exodus 12:1-17

The LORD said to Moses and Aaron in Egypt, "This month is to be for you the first month, the first month of your year. Tell the whole community of Israel that on the tenth day of this month each man is to take a lamb for his family, one for each household. If any household is too small for a whole lamb, they must share one with their nearest neighbor, having taken into account the number of people there are. You are to determine the amount of lamb needed in accordance with what each person will eat. The animals you choose must be year-old males without defect, and you may take them from the sheep or the goats. Take care of them until the fourteenth day of the month, when all the people of the community of Israel must slaughter them at twilight. Then they are to take some of the blood and put it on the sides and tops of the doorframes of the houses where they eat the lambs. That same night they are to eat the meat roasted over the fire, along with bitter herbs, and bread made without yeast. Do not eat the meat raw or cooked in water, but roast it over the fire—head, legs and inner parts. Do not leave any of it till morning; if some is left till morning, you must burn it. This is how you are to eat it: with your cloak tucked into your belt, your sandals on your feet and your staff in your hand. Eat it in haste; it is the LORD'S Passover. "On that same night I will pass through Egypt and strike down every firstborn—both men and animals—and I will bring judgment on all the gods of Egypt. I am the LORD. The blood will be a sign for you on the houses where you are; and when I_{r}

see the blood, I will pass over you. No destructive plague will touch you when I strike Egypt. "This is a day you are to commemorate; for the generations to come you shall celebrate it as a festival to the LORD—a lasting ordinance. For seven days you are to eat bread made without yeast. On the first day remove the yeast from your houses, for whoever eats anything with yeast in it from the first day through the seventh must be cut off from Israel. On the first day hold a sacred assembly, and another one on the seventh day. Do no work at all on these days, except to prepare food for everyone to eat—that is all you may do. "Celebrate the Feast of Unleavened Bread, because it was on this very day that I brought your divisions out of Egypt. Celebrate this day as a lasting ordinance for the generations to come.

VERSE OF THE DAY

- P: As often as you eat this bread and drink the cup
- C: you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

THE GOSPEL LESSON

John 13:1-17

It was just before the Passover Festival. Jesus knew that the hour had come for him to leave this world and go to the Father. Having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end. The evening meal was in progress, and the devil had already prompted Judas, the son of Simon Iscariot, to betray Jesus. Jesus knew that the Father had put all things under his power, and that he had come from God and was returning to God; so he got up from the meal, took off his outer clothing, and wrapped a towel around his waist. After that, he poured water into a basin and began to wash his disciples' feet, drying them with the towel that was wrapped around him. He came to Simon Peter, who said to him, "Lord, are you going to wash my feet?" Jesus replied, "You do not realize now what I am doing, but later you will understand." "No," said Peter, "you shall never wash my feet." Jesus answered, "Unless I wash you, you have no part with me." "Then, Lord," Simon Peter replied, "not just my feet but my hands and my head as well!" Jesus answered, "Those who have had a bath need only to wash their feet; their whole body is clean. And you are clean, though not every one of you." For he knew who was going to betray him, and that was why he said not every one was clean. When he had finished washing their feet, he put on his clothes and returned to his place. "Do you understand what I have done for you?" he asked them. "You call me 'Teacher' and 'Lord,' and rightly so, for that is what I am. Now that I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also should wash one another's feet. I have set you an example that you should do as I have done for you. Very truly I tell you, no servant is greater than his master, nor is a messenger greater than the one who sent him. Now that you know these things, you will be blessed if you do them.

After the benediction in the evening service the altar will be stripped, marking the transition from the celebration of Holy Communion to Jesus' crucifixion and death. Symbolically, the Lord Jesus, stripped of his power and glory, is now in the hands of his captors. The events of Good Friday are near. The congregation observes the ceremony in solemn contemplation. as we also listen to selections from Psalms 31-32, while watching the betrayal in the upper room.
