CONFIRMATION

**The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge,
but fools despise wisdom and instruction. *Proverbs 16:9***

Holy Baptism is the washing of regeneration and renewing of the Holy Spirit, which God poured out on us abundantly through our Savior, Jesus Christ. Justified by his grace, we have been made heirs according to the hope of eternal life. In this Sacrament our loving God receives little children into his covenant and rule of grace, working faith in them and making them members of the invisible Church and temples of the Holy Spirit.



As our Lord faithfully keeps his covenant of mercy, he also promises those who are his own: "Be faithful to death, and I will give you a crown of life!" To the end that his will might be accomplished and his children may grow in grace and Christian knowledge and wisdom as they advance in years, he commands parents to "bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord." He directs his church to do what he told Peter, "Feed My lambs!"

According to his promise and command, children are instructed in the Christian faith. When they reach an age of discretion and understand God's covenant of grace into which his Spirit called them at the time of their baptism, they promise to daily live according to his will. They do this not because they "have to," but because they want to serve him out of love and thanks. Now able to examine themselves and to recognize our Savior's true body and blood in the Sacrament of Holy Communion, they should also receive this Sacrament often along with their fellow members of the family of faith.



To encourage such growth in Christian knowledge and faith, the rite of **CONFIRMATION** is maintained in the Evangelical Lutheran Church. The catechumens publicly profess their faith in Christ, confirming their covenant with God. Assured that they possess such knowledge of biblical doctrine to warrant the worthy reception of the Lord's Supper, our elders invite them to receive it in true faith. We ask the Holy Spirit through his Gospel in Word and Sacrament to cause them to grow in grace, to remain steadfast and immovable in trusting their Savior's love, to become increasingly fruitful in all good works, and in the end to receive the promised crown of life.

WORSHIP NOTES: *We extend a warm welcome today to the family and friends of our confirmands. Through this rite of “passage” these students will confirm the faith which the Holy Spirit implanted in them by baptism. As they have demonstrated the ability to learn the truths of God’s Word, today we encourage them to keep growing in relationship with their Savior each day. We walk with them down the road of Christian maturity, asking ourselves, “How precious is Christ, the divine Teacher, to me? Do I let him serve me as Savior and lead me as Lord?” During this time each year we listen and learn along with our confirmands to love him more. Together we recommit our lives to him, which is our faithful response to his love and grace. (2 Corinthians 5:14-15)*

ORDER OF WORSHIP

INVOCATION

- P:** In the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit.
Lift up the name of the Lord with me:
- C:** **And let us exalt his name together.**
- P:** Enter into his gates with thanksgiving, and into his courts with praises:
- C:** **Let us be thankful as we worship him.**
- P:** For the Lord is good; his mercy is everlasting:
- C:** **And his truth endures for all generations.**
- P:** The law from his mouth is more precious to me than thousands of pieces of silver and gold.
- C:** **His hands have made me and formed me; O Lord, give me understanding to learn your ways, for I have put my hope in your Word.**

THE CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

- P:** If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and there is no truth in us. But if we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to purify us from all unrighteousness. In that hope and confidence, let us humbly confess . . .
- C:** **Lord God, Heavenly Father, I come before your throne and admit my sins. Throughout my life, including this past week, I have been incredibly selfish. The old sinful nature within me judges everything for my own advantage. As a result of my selfishness, I often experience sinful thoughts and desires such as greed, jealousy, covetousness, rebellion, the desire for revenge. And as a result of my sinful thoughts, I often speak and act in ways that hurt and offend you as well as my fellow human beings. Heavenly Father, I know that nothing I do or say can ever earn your forgiveness. Yet I also know that you are a good and gracious God. I know that you sent Jesus to carry my sins, together with the world's sins, on the cross. He died for me! Let me hear your words of forgiveness so that my heart and soul might be reassured. Let me experience the peace and joy of salvation that comes only through faith in Christ.**
- P:** Dear brothers and sisters in the Lord, I stand before you as God's representative to proclaim to you his love and forgiveness. Jesus kept the law, suffered and died in our place. Out of love, he fully and freely gives to you and to me his righteousness without any merit or worthiness on our part. He says to us:

"Though your sins are like scarlet,
They shall be as white as snow;
Though they are red like crimson,
They shall be like wool." (Is. 1:18)

May God enable us to believe his message with all our hearts, that by the power of the Holy Spirit through the Gospel, it may transform and renew our minds and our lives.

- C:** **We glorify your name, O Lord, our gracious God!**

GOSPEL LESSON JOHN 14:23-29

Jesus continues to prepare the disciples for his visible departure. The new command to love one another also means loving him and his Word. Loving Jesus means obeying his teaching. We do not fear at the thought of this impossible task. The gift of the Spirit comes to bring knowledge and peace. With untroubled hearts, we believe.

Jesus replied, "If anyone loves me, he will obey my teaching. My Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our home with him. He who does not love me will not obey my teaching. These words you hear are not my own; they belong to the Father who sent me. "All this I have spoken while still with you. But the Counselor, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you. Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid. "You heard me say, 'I am going away and I am coming back to you.' If you loved me, you would be glad that I am going to the Father, for the Father is greater than I. I have told you now before it happens, so that when it does happen you will believe.

RITE OF CONFIRMATION

You are here to make a public profession of your Christian faith. The Apostle Paul writing to the Romans says: "If you confess with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved ... For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you confess and are saved. Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved."

Therefore, lift up your hearts to the God of all grace and joyfully answer these questions:

P: Do you this day in the presence of God and of this congregation acknowledge that in Baptism, God gave you the forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation?

C: **I do.**

P: Do you reject the devil along with all his lies and empty promises?

C: **I do.**

P: Do you believe in God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit?

C: **I believe in God, the Father almighty,
maker of heaven and earth.**

**I believe in Jesus Christ, his only son, our Lord,
who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,
born of the virgin Mary,
suffered under Pontius Pilate,
was crucified, died, and was buried.
He descended into hell.
The third day he rose again from the dead.
He ascended into heaven
and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty.
From there he will come to judge the living and the dead.**

**I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church
the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins,
the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen**

P: Do you believe all the books of the Bible to be the inspired Word of God?

C: **I do.**

P: Do you believe that the teaching of the Evangelical Lutheran Church, as you have learned to know it from Luther's Small Catechism, is faithful and true to the Word of God?

C: **I do.**

P: Do you intend to continue steadfast in this teaching and to endure all things, even death, rather than fall away from it?

C: I do, by the grace of God.

P: Do you intend faithfully to conform all your life to the teachings of God's Word; to be faithful in the use of the Word and Sacrament; and in faith and action remain true to God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, as long as you live?

C: I do, and I ask God to help me.

P: Since it is God alone who enables us both to will and to do his good pleasure, it is right for us, dear friends in Christ, to call on him for *these confirmands*, that he would graciously complete the good work which he has begun in *them*. Let us, therefore, bow our heads and pray.

P: Lord Jesus, Author and Perfecter of our faith, in mercy you joined *these brothers and sisters* to your Church when *they* were born again of water and the Spirit. In mercy you taught *them* your saving truth. Grant that *they* may offer themselves as living sacrifices to you as *their* spiritual act of worship. Transform *them* by the renewing of *their* minds so that they will not conform to the pattern of this world. Help us live in love and harmony with one another, and work together in serving you. Keep us united in your Spirit and bring us at last to your eternal kingdom where you live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

C: Amen.

THE BLESSING FROM GOD

P: Confirmands, receive His Word of blessing.

P: Upon this your profession and promise, I invite and welcome you, as members of the Evangelical Lutheran Church and of this congregation, to share with us in all the gifts our Lord has for His Church and to live them out continually in His worship and in His service.

PARENTS' VOW OF SUPPORT FOR LUTHERAN CATECHUMENS

P: When you brought these children to be baptized, you realized that you were following the will of your Lord Jesus, who said, LET THE LITTLE CHILDREN COME TO ME. At the same time, you understood that your responsibilities had not ended at the Baptism. You knew that the Scriptures also commanded you to BRING UP YOUR CHILDREN IN THE TRAINING AND INSTRUCTION OF THE LORD. This you have done in your homes and by using the assistance that has been offered by your fellow Christians in this congregation. However, your Lord Jesus wants you to remember that your duties to these children continue long past the day of Confirmation. Therefore, I ask you:

P: Do you intend to help these young people carry out the vow they have just spoken?

ANS: I do.

P: Do you intend to encourage them to remain faithful to Jesus and to all of God's Word as it's proclaimed in the Confessions of the Evangelical Lutheran Church?

ANS: I do.

P: Do you intend to continue to instruct and guide them as you have opportunity with God's Word as your only authority?

ANS: I do.

P: Do you intend to bring them regularly to worship services and have them participate in Bible Study, both in the congregational life and their own personal lives?

ANS: I do.

P: Do you intend to encourage them to serve their Lord Jesus throughout their lives in everything they do, especially throughout their lives in their Christian congregation?

ANS: I do.

P: Do you intend to be an example for them of such a Christian life and lifestyle by how you live and how you speak?

ANS: I do so intend to do all these things, with the help of God and by his grace.
