VERSE OF THE DAY "But for you who revere my name, the sun of righteousness will rise with healing in its wings. And you will go out and leap like calves released from the stall." Malachi 4:2

WORSHIP NOTES: Welcome to our worship this morning! Our risen and ascended Lord will return to "judge the living and the dead." We confess it every Sunday, but often live like those are empty words. The book of Hebrews freshens our perspective on the old covenant pictures. The tabernacle procedures were not irrelevant because they sketched a framework for the full portrait of our salvation. Here we see color added to the black-and-white images of sacrifice and we encounter the parallel reality of a holy place in heaven. Jesus, himself the victim and the priest, has fulfilled all expectations! He's done it! And we learn again to be profoundly aware of his kindness and grace in Christ. There's no need to fear Judgment Day; rather, we can look forward to the "DAY of our ATONEMENT."

PRAYER OF THE DAY: Lord God Almighty, so rule and govern our hearts and minds by your Holy Spirit that we may always look forward to the end of this present evil age and to the day of your righteous judgment. Keep us steadfast in true and living faith and present us at last holy and blameless before you; through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

God Welcomes Us

- **P**: On behalf of our risen Savior Jesus Christ, I welcome you all to God's house. But why have you come?
- C: We share the Psalmist's joy when he said, I rejoice with those who said to me, 'Let us go to the house of the Lord.' We come with joy to rejoice that God is our Savior.
- **P**: How good it is to rejoice in the name of the Lord. Let's begin then by lifting up our hearts and voices in praise to God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

God Forgives Us

P: Dear brothers and sisters in Christ: The word of God urges us to confess to the Lord all the wrong that is in us. This is something we do with a heart full of humility and penitence at all times, but we especially do it when we meet together to thank God for what he has done for us, to praise him, and to hear his word. So come with me now to God's throne of grace, and let us confess our sins together.

WE CONFESS OUR SINS

C: Almighty and merciful Father, we confess that we have wandered from your way like lost sheep. We have followed our own sinful desires, and have disobeyed your laws. We have done things you have forbidden, and we have ignored things you have commanded. We admit that we are thoroughly corrupt by nature. There is nothing good about us. Lord, show us your mercy. You have promised to do this for Jesus' sake.

WE RECEIVE FORGIVENESS

P: You have confessed your sins before Almighty God. Now be strengthened in faith, remembering that he does not want any sinner to die, but would rather have him turn from his evil ways and live. As a called servant of the Word, and by God's command and authority, I forgive you all your sins. Rest assured, that your sins have been covered by the blood and righteousness of Jesus Christ, your Savior. God's peace be with you. Let us rejoice in his full and free forgiveness!

God Teaches Us

WE PONDER THE OLD TESTAMENT LESSON Malachi 4:1-3

In the judgment all the weariness of the flesh will fall away, and we will leap for joy at the just judgment of God. Those who have rejected his just judgment in this life will not be able to escape in the life to come. Assuming that we did what we could to share the gospel message with them, we will not mourn at the misery they have brought down on themselves by their despising of so great a blessing as that won by the Savior at so great a cost to him.

"Surely the day is coming; it will burn like a furnace. All the arrogant and every evildoer will be stubble, and that day that is coming will set them on fire," says the LORD Almighty. "Not a root or a branch will be left to them. But for you who revere my name, the sun of righteousness will rise with healing in its wings. And you will go out and leap like calves released from the stall. Then you will trample down the wicked; they will be ashes under the soles of your feet on the day when I do these things," says the LORD Almighty.

WE LISTEN TO THE SECOND LESSON John 5:19-30

Jesus assures us that there is a happy harmony between himself and his Father in everything. Therefore we need not fear that what he has said might be contradicted by his Father. Quite the contrary: the Father loves his incarnate Son so much that everything has already been handed over to him. What a delight and a joy now, in the hour of our death, and on the Day of Judgment to hear his Word! By his Word we are assured of everlasting life. Therefore worship the Son who has won that life for us. What else is there really worth doing? May all of our life be an act of honor to the Son of God, our Judge, our Life, our Savior, our All!

Jesus gave them this answer: "I tell you the truth, the Son can do nothing by himself; he can do only what he sees his Father doing, because whatever the Father does the Son also does. ²⁰For the Father loves the Son and shows him all he does. Yes, to your amazement he will show him even greater things than these. For just as the Father raises the dead and gives them life, even so the Son gives life to whom he is pleased to give it. Moreover, the Father judges no one, but has entrusted all judgment to the Son, that all may honor the Son just as they honor the Father. He who does not honor the Son does not honor the Father, who sent him. "I tell you the truth, whoever hears my word and believes him who sent me has eternal life and will not be condemned; he has crossed over from death to life. I tell you the truth, a time is coming and has now come when the dead will hear the voice of the Son of God and those who hear will live. For as the Father has life in himself, so he has granted the Son to have life in himself. And he has given him authority to judge because he is the Son of Man. "Do not be amazed at this, for a time is coming when all who are in their graves will hear his voice and come out—those who have done good will rise to live, and those who have done evil will rise to be condemned. By myself I can do nothing; I judge only as I hear, and my judgment is just, for I seek not to please myself but him who sent me.

HEBREWS 9:24-28

"Do We Grasp Why He's Coming Back?"

For Christ did not enter a man-made sanctuary that was only a copy of the true one; he entered heaven itself, now to appear for us in God's presence. Nor did he enter heaven to offer himself again and again, the way the high priest enters the Most Holy Place every year with blood that is not his own. Then Christ would have had to suffer many times since the creation of the world. But

now he has appeared once for all at the end of the ages to do away with sin by the sacrifice of himself. Just as man is destined to die once, and after that to face judgment, o Christ was sacrificed once to take away the sins of many people; and he will appear a second time, not to bear sin, but to bring salvation to those who are waiting for him.

WE STATE WHAT WE BELIEVE - NICENE CREED

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. Intro: How on earth will we fix this? Can humans create a mishap so great that we can't fix it? Yes, indeed we can and have! The sacrificial system wasn't for "our doing" but for one who "has done it." This is how the Gospel secures us before the judgment seat.

Do We Grasp Why He's Coming Back?

1. Not to do what he has already done...

- 1.1 In this case, history doesn't repeat itself.
- 1.2 There is only ONE Savior: God's solution to sin.
- 1.3 As our true high priest he stepped in and sacrificed himself "for us."

App: Jesus came to repair what had been broken. His "fix" was not temporary, but "once for all." This is how Hebrews puts color to the previous black-and-white picture of promise.

2. But to bring us what he has already won!

- 2.1 We can't fall prey to the DIY attitude of our day.
- 2.2 This is the hardest, dirtiest job that only HE could do.
- 2.3 Do you know how this Jesus loves you, has repaired your life?

App: Sometimes we DIY'ers have to give way to an expert. We admit that we don't have the skill or tools needed for the job and we stand back to watch. What relief then when the impossible has been accomplished.

Conclusion: We rejoice at the end of the church year to face boldly the reality of our sin, death and impending judgment. For in our desperate admission that we can't fix it, we discover that he can, he has and he's coming back to prove it "once for all."
