PRAYER OF THE DAY Lord Jesus Christ, by your victory you have broken the power of the evil one. THE NICENE CREED

Use your power to calm the unrest among nations and peoples so that your kingdom may spread and grow.

- P: O Christ our King, you have supremacy over all. You will judge the world in righteousness and the peoples with equity. You have destroyed death and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel. Reign in our hearts that we may serve you more faithfully and speak more boldly to others of your saving love.

P: Hear us, Lord, as we bring you our private petitions. *Silent prayer*.





WORDS OF INSTITUTION


