

- **WORSHIP NOTES** The emphasis in the season of Advent is not so much on our Savior's birth as it is on his return as our King, and so also on the preparations we need to be making as we await his royal return. Words of repentance, expectation and hope call for our attention during Advent. These are themes that run counter to the world's pre-Christmas emphasis. Secular society, impelled by the desire for instant gratification, celebrates a secular Christmas with the expectation of experiencing fulfillment now. By contrast, Christians express their yearning during Advent for fulfillment in the future when Jesus comes back again. Look for this emphasis during the Advent season in the hymns, the Psalms, the appointed lessons and the sermons. This also explains why we defer the singing of Christmas hymns and carols until just before the Christmas season comes.
- **PRAYER BEFORE WORSHIP** Stir up your power, O Lord, and come. Protect us by your strength and save us from the threatening dangers of our sins and temptation in an evil world, for you live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. AMEN.

- **P:** God, our heavenly Father, has been merciful to us and has given his only Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by his authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen.

P: For the well-being of your holy Church in all the world and for those who offer here their worship and praise, hear our prayer, O Lord.



PRAYER OF THE DAY

FIRST READING Isaiah 11:1-10

A shoot will come up from the stump of Jesse; from his roots a Branch will bear fruit. The Spirit of the Lord will rest on him the Spirit of wisdom and of understanding, the Spirit of counsel and of power, the Spirit of knowledge and of the fear of the Lord - and he will delight in the fear of the Lord . He will not judge by what he sees with his eyes, or decide by what he hears with his ears; but with righteousness he will judge the needy, with justice he will give decisions for the poor of the earth. He will strike the earth with the rod of his mouth; with the breath of his lips he will slay the wicked. Righteousness will be his belt and faithfulness the sash around his waist. The wolf will live with the lamb, the leopard will lie down with the goat, the calf and the lion and the yearling together; and a little child will lead them. The cow will feed with the bear, their young will lie down together, and the lion will eat straw like the ox. The infant will play near the hole of the cobra, and the young child put his hand into the viper's nest. They will neither harm nor destroy on all my holy mountain, for the earth will be full of the knowledge of the Lord as the waters cover the sea. In that day the Root of Jesse will stand as a banner for the peoples; the nations will rally to him, and his place of rest will be glorious.

Oh, come and reign o'er ev'ry land; Let Satan from his throne be hurled. Let nations bow to your command; Let grace revive a dying world.

SECOND READING Hebrews 1:1-9

In the past God spoke to our forefathers through the prophets at many times and in various ways, but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, and through whom he made the universe. The Son is the radiance of God's glory and the exact representation of his being, sustaining all things by his powerful word. After he had provided purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty in heaven. So he became as much superior to the angels as the name he has inherited is superior to theirs. For to which of the angels did God ever say, "You are my Son; today I have become your Father "? Or again, "I will be his Father, and he will be my Son"? And again, when God brings his firstborn into the world, he says, "Let all God's angels worship him." In speaking of the angels he says, "He makes his angels winds, his servants flames of fire." But about the Son he says, "Your throne, O God, will last for ever and ever, and righteousness will be the scepter of your kingdom. You have loved righteousness and hated wickedness; therefore God, your God, has set you above your companions by anointing you with the oil of joy."

THE GOSPEL John 12:23-29

Jesus replied, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. I tell you the truth, unless a kernel of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains only a single seed. But if it dies, it produces many seeds. The man who loves his life will lose it, while the man who hates his life in this world will keep it for eternal life. Whoever serves me must follow me; and where I am, my servant also will be. My Father will honor the one who serves me. "Now my heart is troubled, and what shall I say? 'Father, save me from this hour'? No, it was for this very reason I came to this hour. Father, glorify your name!" Then a voice came from heaven, "I have glorified it, and will glorify it again." The crowd that was there and heard it said it had thundered; others said an angel had spoken to him.

NICENE CREED

and the life of the world to come. Amen.




THE SACRAMENT


WORDS OF INSTITUTION

THE DISTRIBUTION HYMN


"Arise, O Christian People"
