

But Jesus, my Savior, paid for my sins


with his innocent suffering and death.


Trusting in him, I pray: God, have mercy on me, a sinner.

¹⁸"And I, because of what they have planned and done, am about to come and gather the people of all nations and languages, and they will come and see my glory.



Hebrews 12:18-24



²⁷"But he will reply, 'I don't know you or where you come from. Away from me, all you evildoers!'



Nicene Creed
