
THE COMMON SERVICE CW, p. 15

What does this mean?


I believe that I cannot, by my own thinking or choosing, believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him.




P: Let us give thanks to the Lord, our God.

P: The peace of the Lord be with you always.






- Too soon we rise; the vessels disappear;
