
## Pentecost 2

#### WE GATHER FOR WORSHIP (selected verses from Psalm 104)

- **P:** How many are your works, O LORD! In wisdom you made them all. These all look to you to give them their food at the proper time.

#### WE HEAR THE WORD FROM THE FIRST LESSON Jonah 2

<sup>1</sup>From inside the fish Jonah prayed to the LORD his God. <sup>2</sup>He said:

"In my distress I called to the LORD,

and he answered me.

From deep in the realm of the dead I called for help,

and you listened to my cry.

<sup>3</sup>You hurled me into the depths,

into the very heart of the seas,

and the currents swirled about me;

all your waves and breakers

swept over me.

<sup>4</sup>I said, 'I have been banished

from your sight;

yet I will look again

toward your holy temple.'

<sup>5</sup>The engulfing waters threatened me,

the deep surrounded me;

seaweed was wrapped around my head.

<sup>6</sup>To the roots of the mountains I sank down; the earth beneath barred me in forever. But you, LORD my God, brought my life up from the pit.

<sup>7</sup>"When my life was ebbing away, I remembered you, LORD, and my prayer rose to you, to your holy temple.

<sup>8</sup>"Those who cling to worthless idols turn away from God's love for them.
<sup>9</sup>But I, with shouts of grateful praise, will sacrifice to you.
What I have vowed I will make good. I will say, 'Salvation comes from the LORD.' "

#### WE HEAR THE WORD FROM THE SECOND LESSON Acts 27:13-26

When a gentle south wind began to blow, they saw their opportunity; so they weighed anchor and sailed along the shore of Crete. Before very long, a wind of hurricane force, called the Northeaster, swept down from the island. The ship was caught by the storm and could not head into the wind; so we gave way to it and were driven along. As we passed to the lee of a small island called Cauda, we were hardly able to make the lifeboat secure, so the men hoisted it aboard. Then they passed ropes under the ship itself to hold it together. Because they were afraid they would run aground on the sandbars of Syrtis, they lowered the sea anchor and let the ship be driven along. We took such a violent battering from the storm that the next day they began to throw the cargo overboard. On the third day, they threw the ship's tackle overboard with their own hands. When neither sun nor stars appeared for many days and the storm continued raging, we finally gave up all hope of being saved.

After they had gone a long time without food, Paul stood up before them and said: "Men, you should have taken my advice not to sail from Crete; then you would have spared yourselves this damage and loss. But now I urge you to keep up your courage, because not one of you will be lost; only the ship will be destroyed. Last night an angel of the God to whom I belong and whom I serve stood beside me and said, 'Do not be afraid, Paul. You must stand trial before Caesar; and God has graciously given you the lives of all who sail with you.' So keep up your courage, men, for I have faith in God that it will happen just as he told me. Nevertheless, we must run aground on some island."

#### WE HEAR THE WORD FROM THE SECOND LESSON Mark 4:35–41

<sup>35</sup>That day when evening came, he said to his disciples, "Let us go over to the other side." <sup>36</sup>Leaving the crowd behind, they took him along, just as he was, in the boat. There were also other boats with him. <sup>37</sup>A furious squall came up, and the waves broke over the boat, so that it was nearly swamped. <sup>38</sup>Jesus was in the stern, sleeping on a cushion. The disciples woke him and said to him, "Teacher, don't you care if we drown?"

<sup>39</sup>He got up, rebuked the wind and said to the waves, "Quiet! Be still!" Then the wind died down and it was completely calm.

<sup>40</sup>He said to his disciples, "Why are you so afraid? Do you still have no faith?"

<sup>41</sup>They were terrified and asked each other, "Who is this? Even the wind and the waves obey him!"


There is a river whose streams make glad the city of God,\* the holy place where the Most High dwells.
