

# A NOTE ABOUT OUR SERVICE

Tonight's service is a Tenebrae, or service of darkness. This service reflects on the Lord's crucifixion and our repentance through lessons and hymns. Over the course of the service, candles are extinguished until only one remains. That candle is removed from the chancel, leaving the sanctuary in darkness. The service closes with a *strepitus*, a loud noise that foreshadows the rending of Christ's tomb on Easter. The solitary candle is then returned to the sanctuary in anticipation of the resurrection.

After the solitary candle returns in anticipation of the resurrection, the lights in the sanctuary will be turned on. The congregation can remain as long as they would like for prayer and meditation before dispersing on their own.

Tonight we contemplate the words Jesus spoke on the cross. As we do so, we consider how those words reveal the depth of God's love for us.

Worshipers may gather in silence.

The minister enters in silence.

Reading Isaiah 52:13—53:12

<sup>13</sup>See, my servant will act wisely;

he will be raised and lifted up and highly exalted.

<sup>14</sup>Just as there were many who were appalled at him his appearance was so disfigured beyond that of any human being and his form marred beyond human likeness—

<sup>15</sup>so he will sprinkle many nations, and kings will shut their mouths because of him. For what they were not told, they will see,

and what they have not heard, they will understand.

<sup>1</sup>Who has believed our message and to whom has the arm of the LORD been revealed? <sup>2</sup>He grew up before him like a tender shoot, and like a root out of dry ground. He had no beauty or majesty to attract us to him,

<sup>3</sup>He was despised and rejected by mankind, a man of suffering, and familiar with pain.

<sup>4</sup>Surely he took up our pain and bore our suffering, yet we considered him punished by God, stricken by him, and afflicted. <sup>5</sup>But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was on him, and by his wounds we are healed. <sup>6</sup>We all, like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to our own way; and the LORD has laid on him the iniquity of us all.

7He was oppressed and afflicted, yet he did not open his mouth;
he was led like a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before its shearers is silent, so he did not open his mouth.
8By oppression and judgment he was taken away. Yet who of his generation protested?
For he was cut off from the land of the living; for the transgression of my people he was punished.
9He was assigned a grave with the wicked, and with the rich in his death, though he had done no violence, nor was any deceit in his mouth.

<sup>10</sup>Yet it was the LORD's will to crush him and cause him to suffer, and though the LORD makes his life an offering for sin, he will see his offspring and prolong his days, and the will of the LORD will prosper in his hand.
 <sup>11</sup>After he has suffered, he will see the light of life and be satisfied; by his knowledge my righteous servant will justify many, and he will bear their iniquities.

Therefore I will give him a portion among the great, and he will divide the spoils with the strong,
 because he poured out his life unto death, and was numbered with the transgressors.
 For he bore the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors.

<sup>32</sup>Two other men, both criminals, were also led out with him to be executed. <sup>33</sup>When they came to the place called the Skull, they crucified him there, along with the criminals—one on his right, the other on his left. <sup>34</sup>Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing." And they divided up his clothes by casting lots.

He bore the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors.



Let him deliver him, since he delights in him."


Remember me, Lord, when you show favor to your people.



<sup>25</sup>Near the cross of Jesus stood his mother, his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene. <sup>26</sup>When Jesus saw his mother there, and the disciple whom he loved standing nearby, he said to her, "Woman, here is your son," <sup>27</sup>and to the disciple, "Here is your mother." From that time on, this disciple took her into his home.

My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? Why are you so far from saving me, so far from my cries of anguish?


My God, I cry out by day but you do not answer, by night, but I find no rest.

Seventh Word Luke 23:44–46

<sup>44</sup>It was now about noon, and darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon, <sup>45</sup>for the sun stopped shining. And the curtain of the temple was torn in two. <sup>46</sup>Jesus called out with a loud voice, "Father, into your hands I commit my spirit." When he had said this, he breathed his last.


Into your hands I commit my spirit; deliver me, Lord, my faithful God.

He has not despised or scorned the suffering of the afflicted one; he has not hidden his face from him but has listened to his cry for help.

He poured out his life unto death, and was numbered with the transgressors. He bore the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors.

Loving Savior, at the moment of your death you gave yourself into the loving hands of your Father. As we close our eyes in death, lead us to commit our bodies and souls to him who has summoned us by name and made us his own because of you and your love. Then, we pray, let us depart in peace.

Reading John 19:31–42

<sup>31</sup>Now it was the day of Preparation, and the next day was to be a special Sabbath. Because the Jewish leaders did not want the bodies left on the crosses during the Sabbath, they asked Pilate to have the legs broken and the bodies taken down. <sup>32</sup>The soldiers therefore came and broke the legs of the first man who had been crucified with Jesus, and then those of the other. <sup>33</sup>But when they came to Jesus and found that he was already dead, they did not break his legs. <sup>34</sup>Instead, one of the soldiers pierced Jesus' side with a spear, bringing a sudden flow of blood and water. <sup>35</sup>The man who saw it has given testimony, and his testimony is true. He knows that he tells the truth, and he testifies so that you also may believe. <sup>36</sup>These things happened so that the scripture would be fulfilled: "Not one of his bones will be broken," <sup>37</sup>and, as another scripture says, "They will look on the one they have pierced."

<sup>38</sup>Later, Joseph of Arimathea asked Pilate for the body of Jesus. Now Joseph was a disciple of Jesus, but secretly because he feared the Jewish leaders. With Pilate's permission, he came and took the body away. <sup>39</sup>He was accompanied by Nicodemus, the man who earlier had visited Jesus at night. Nicodemus brought a mixture of myrrh and aloes, about seventy-five pounds. <sup>40</sup>Taking Jesus' body, the two of them wrapped it, with the spices, in strips of linen. This was in accordance with Jewish burial customs. <sup>41</sup>At the place where Jesus was crucified, there was a garden, and in the garden a new tomb, in which no one had ever been laid. <sup>42</sup>Because it was the Jewish day of Preparation and since the tomb was nearby, they laid Jesus there.

Silence for meditation

The seventh candle is carried from the chancel.

A loud noise (the strepitus) representing the rending of Christ's tomb is heard, and the seventh candle is returned to the chancel.

Worshippers may remain for prayer and meditation and then disperse as they desire.

Offerings may be placed in the box as you exit the sanctuary.

The congregation exits in silence.
